To bee or not to bee......

Melanie and I celebrate our 5th anniversary in the Thurton Benefice in June and it was not long after arriving to a large, country Rectory garden that I decided to act on a dream I had nurtured for many years - to become a beekeeper. It was perfect, given that we have a 'master' beekeeper in the Bramerton Group.

Being someone whose watchwords are 'action now' it was, of course, three years before I actually signed up for one of John Everett's excellent beekeeping courses for beginners. A thoroughly enjoyable experience where I learned so much about the fascinating world of the bee and the magical and mysterious workings of the beehive. This was wonderful! I completed the course and received my certificate and in the following months devoured numerous books on the subject before finally taking delivery of my first beehive - a gift from my wife for Christmas 2018.

I was ready and fully prepared when John called in one warm Spring evening with my first colony. Appropriately suited and booted and with smoker in hand I lifted the lid and dived in. This was when the problems began.......

I soon discovered that bees do not do what the books tell you. Perhaps they cannot read?

Bees live in an amazing world of their own; a single bee is of little significance (well, except when it stings you - then it has quite an impact) but collectively the colony works as an extremely efficient community.

In a beehive, the female of the species is dominant. The Queen is King, so to speak, and all the bees with an important role - cleaning, processing and storing food, looking after the young, protecting the hive and foraging for food are girls. The boys hang around eating food and looking for a mate. They are so superfluous that at the end of the summer most of them are killed off or driven from the hive because they are a bit of a waste of space and will eat the precious winter stores of food.

Left to their own devices, bees can live a happy life. Building up the colony, storing food for the winter, splitting the colony to create a new colony and expand the species (swarming) and generally live an efficient if, for each bee, a short life. The individual is nothing, the colony is a force to be reckoned with.

Into this efficient eco system steps man. In the hive we try to recreate the hole in the tree where the bees would naturally live; we try our best to stop them splitting the colony and expanding their number; on a regular basis we take the roof off and rummage uninvited in the rooms of their home, and to add a final insult we steal all their winter stores of food - the product of all their hard work over the summer months. Is it any wonder they do not want to play ball with us?

The problem is that the beekeeper is fighting against nature and not surprisingly nature usually wins. At the end of my first summer, the colony had struggled to reach its potential 50,000 bee population, had swarmed once, produced precisely no honey for me to harvest and had cost me a small fortune in sugar syrup to feed the colony and give it the best chance of surviving the winter (which by some miracle it did).



Seeing my lack of beekeeping self-esteem, Melanie bought me a book by the television and radio presenter Bill Turnbull, himself a keen, but inept beekeeper. The title said it all: 'The Bad Beekeepers Club'. I read the book, laughing at his mishaps and realised that here was a kindred spirit. I took solace in the fact that it is ok to be keen but inept. More importantly he gave me an insight I had not considered before there is no such thing as a master beekeeper. (John Everett may disagree with me here......). My dictionary defines a 'master' as "a person who commands or controls ... who has complete knowledge of an art". I rest my case.

The truth is that it is the bee who is master, not the beekeeper. The bee has a genetic knowledge that ensures it knows everything that it needs to do for the good of the colony and the beekeeper cannot compare. As a consequence of this revelation, beekeeping has become much more enjoyable for me; I can accept my constant failures safe in the knowledge that I am not supposed to be perfect.

On reflection, I accepted this as a priest and a Christian many years ago. The Christian life is one where we must accept - indeed embrace - our failings and weaknesses for by doing so we approach the One who is the Master. In common with beekeeping, we cannot grow as Christians by sitting indoors reading books (even the Bible!). We have to step outside, lift off the lid and dive in in the sure and certain knowledge that we will make mistakes, we will get it wrong at times. But through those mistakes we learn, we grow, we adjust and we draw closer to God.

At the end of June we welcome Cate Turner and her family to the Thurton Benefice as our new Curate. She will be here for between three and four years to continue to grow into her calling to the priesthood and I have been trusted to be her Training Incumbent. Cate is also a beekeeper so I suspect she will soon realise my many failings as a beekeeper and a priest and I hope those failings will be an encouragement, not a disappointment.....

The Mystery Of The Missing Vicar

How do you lose a vicar? Before you rush to offer your helpful suggestions, let me clarify. The one I'm talking about lived 450 years ago in Surlingham. But you will not find him on the list of incumbents in the church guide book.

The accepted account of events goes something like this. In 1583, during the reign of Queen Elizabeth I, James Greene had been vicar of Surlingham for 26 years when he made his will, which still survives. After his death, he was succeeded as vicar the following year by Robert Peachie. But the parish register of the time has a different story.



It tells us that "Sir James Greene, vicar of Surlingham, was buried" there on the 12th October 1574, nine years *before* he made his will! The register has been kept meticulously, with everything recorded in due date order, so if it is right, can it enlighten us further about the mysterious ten year gap?

First, in February 1576, "Francis son of Robert Umfrye was buried". Robert Umfrye? Who is he? How sad that his son has died. A year later, a happier occasion: "Johnson of Robert Umfrye, vicar, was baptised". How lovely. But vicar? What vicar? All is revealed seven years later. Just before the next incumbent, Robert Peachie, began his 55-year ministry in May 1584, the last entry reads: "Sir Robert Umfrye, vicar of Surlingham, was buried the 25th April".

Now we know the identity of the forgotten vicar from 1574 to 1584. His son John was 21 when he married Margaret Dowsey at Blofield in 1598. Was one of their descendants the TV and radio presenter John Humfrys? If he were a contestant on Mastermind, the programme he currently hosts, might he choose as his specialist subject "The Vicars of Surlingham in the Reign of Elizabeth I"?

Gladys May ELLIS - 19/01/1925 - 18/04/2020

Gladys was born in Ashill on 19th January, 1925. She was well known by many in our local villages having lived in a number of them over the years, making many friends.

While serving in the WRENS, Gladys was stationed in the Orkney Isles during WWII. After the war she met and married George Ellis and they settled down in Surlingham where they lived happily for many years.

When George, a well known local builder, retired, they moved into a new house and soon became involved in



village activities in Bramerton. They joined the Bowls Club and became members of the Village Hall Committee. George was one the 6 members of the "building gang" who helped to plan and build Bramerton Village hall which was opened in 1989.

Many years later they moved to Yelverton for a short while before a final move into an annex that their only son Robert, also a builder, had built onto his own property in Claxton.

Gladys and George were very proud of and much loved by their two grandchildren, Colin (who sadly died a few years ago) and Lorraine, son and daughter of Robert and his wife Susan. They were also very proud of their much loved great grandson, Thomas, the son of Lorraine and her husband Nick.

There was a private family cremation and a memorial service will be held at a later date when safe to do so.

pray for the community. You may sometimes hear the bell rung as a sign of this continuing activity.




We warmly welcome our new councillor, Marcel Pfrang.



Eleven Good Walks

In these interesting times when, as I write, the Lock-Down may be coming to an end, we will all still need to maintain some form of "social distancing" and do something to keep fit. What better way is there to do that than find good walks on the footpaths and bridleways around the parishes of the Bramerton Group?



booklet titled "Eleven Walks" (see the photo of the cover) with a foreword by Michael Stedman, then Team Rector and Rural Dean of Loddon.

Each walk included a commentary on the route to be followed and Richard's rather excellent hand-drawn map. In the intervening years, changes on the ground including gates and stiles that have both appeared and disappeared have made it necessary to edit the written notes but the maps are still very much up to the mark and easy to follow.

In this edition of Eleven Says (if the Editor can find room) you'll find one of Richard's walks. Others will follow in future issues. So get out there and enjoy the great countryside that we are all lucky enough to share!

Remember, as you go, to protect the land, wildlife and the interests of the people who own the land you're walking across: keep to the footpaths, take care not to damage crops, guard against risks of fire, keep dogs under control, leave no litter and leave all gates as you found them (the farmer may have left a gate open to give his stock access to water).


Finally, I can't resist the temptation to include (below) a Limerick that came to me as I prepared the text for Walk 10 that starts at the George and Dragon in Thurton. Can you, as you walk these routes, come up with more, relevant to the places on Richard Crosskill's maps?

A Footpath Ode

There was a young lady from Thurton Whose 'Eleven Walks' went for a Burton Near The George, on Walk Ten, She fell into a fen

And I think she's still there, but not certain.

WALK 1 BERGH APTON 3 1/4 miles



START: Bergh Apton Church, NR15 1BX.

Park in Church Field, immediately to the East of the church. *Having closed the field gate*, turn right and walk east towards Loddon. Pass Gravel Pit Lane on your right, White Heath Road on your left and Sunnyside (at the red telephone box, now a library) on your right.

Opposite Holly Lodge Barn, take the Bridleway (which means that you can also ride or lead a horse along it if you're so disposed!) on your left. After 150 yards it curves round to the left. Here the official bridleway becomes indistinct so, unless you can follow it, keep to the field edge on your right. Soon after the western limit of the Chet Valley vineyard (on your left) the track swings right and passes through a hedge into a green loke.

Cross over White Heath Road onto the footpath immediately opposite. Go slightly uphill past a small copse on your left to reach a 'T' junction. Turn left. At this point, the tower of Bergh Apton Church will be way over to your left. This is Longlands Lane - a putative Roman road from *Ventalcenorum* (Caistor St Edmund) to the river Chet at Loddon (or, perhaps, to the Yare at Hardley Cross) and thence to *Gariononum*, the Roman fortress at Burgh Castle).

At end of this broad track, just before you reach Dodger's Lane at a small cottage, turn left onto a bridleway. Bergh Apton Church tower is now straight ahead of you.

Your route passes through a hedgerow at a gate and then runs parallel to the wooden railed fence and private driveway (on your right) to reach Church Road. Turn left and then, after about 40 yards and at a deep pond, take the footpath off to your left.

Pass another deep pond on your right and pass through a hedge (there may be a stile here). Now hug the hedgerow on your right, keeping to the headland. At the far end of the field you reach a gravel track.

Turn right and you will get to White Heath Road, opposite a newly-thatched cottage. Turn right and, at the junction with School Road, turn right again.

This will bring you back to Church Field on your left.







- ⁷ a time to tear and a time to mend, a time to be silent and a time to speak,

We have an amazing God who is with us in all of these times, I pray that you will feel him close to you today.

I wrote this reflection for the church I'm working for in Preston. I have learnt a lot in the past few weeks as we adapt to live-streaming services from our homes, recording videos and spending much more time on the phone. It has been wonderful to be part of such a generous church, supporting the community through our food bank and the local hospital with pastoral care. Though I miss the open countryside of Norfolk, I have discovered some beautiful parts of Preston in which I can forget I'm in a city!
