A Glimpse of Glory

At the gate of the city, the philosopher sat and watched people coming in and out. A stranger came by and asked him, "What are people like in this city?" The philosopher asked in return, "What are they like in the city you have come from?" "They're an unfriendly lot," came the reply. "No-one wants to help you, and quite frankly I just want to get away from the miserable place." The philosopher said: "I think you'll find they're just like that here too."

A little later, another traveller passed through the gates. He saw the philosopher and said, "I will be moving to this city shortly. What are people like here?" "What are they like where you come from?" came the rejoinder. "I shall be very sorry to leave them," he said. "We all look after each other, there's a great community, and such a happy spirit." The philosopher said: "I think you'll find they're just like that here too."

Attitude is crucial. Covid 19 has changed our world for ever, but what are we learning from the experience? In the fears and darkness of lockdown we applauded the NHS and key workers we often took for granted. Life was suddenly more precious, and we celebrated it. As lockdown eased, and pent-up emotions sometimes spilled over into violence and irresponsibility, have we been scrambling to get back to "normal", only to find that nothing will ever be the same again?

The 6th August is the 75th anniversary of the dropping of the atomic bomb on Hiroshima. Nothing would ever be the same again. In the Christian calendar, the 6th August recalls the Transfiguration of Christ. His disciples, terrified by ominous predictions of his suffering and death, suddenly saw Jesus radiant with light. Although the vision faded, and they saw "only Jesus", they never forgot that glimpse of glory. They knew that appearances were deceptive. Nothing would ever be the same again.

We have been privileged to glimpse the glory of so much we took for granted: the natural world around us, the beauty of the butterfly, the guiet kindness of a

neighbour, the courage and good humour of heroes we didn't realise we had.
When the vision fades, which way will we choose to live?

Slowly, Steadily, Safely

These three words are at the heart of the message from Bishop Graham as we move into a new stage in this unprecedented situation we have faced as a Church and a country. For the first time in over 800 years our church buildings have been closed and public worship suspended. We have experienced a very particular moment in history, but from the 15th June our churches could re-open for private prayer and from 5th July for public worship.

In the Thurton Benefice our church buildings are open for private prayer from 10am until 12 noon on a rotational basis during the week. Morning Prayer is said at 10am to which anyone is now welcome to join me. The current schedule is: **Tuesday**: Framingham Pigot; **Wednesday**: Thurton; **Thursday**: Yelverton; **Friday**: Ashby St Mary; **Saturday**: Bergh Apton.

A full risk assessment has been completed and signage in place to ensure that anyone visiting the churches can do so in safety. Please ensure you read and follow the notices and sanitise your hands when entering and leaving.

Public Worship will look and feel very different in the coming weeks. Bishop Graham is clear that we should not rush back into the previous multi-service pattern. In response to this request, we will be having just one Benefice Service each week for at least the next two-month rota (which you will find on the back page of this edition of Eleven Says).

The intention is that each parish should have a service on rotation, but we must be mindful of social distancing and the maximum numbers we can safely accommodate in each church. Please follow the direction of the churchwardens as you arrive for the service. All precautions will be in place, including hand sanitisers, disposable service sheets and no hymns; we are also required to keep a record of attendance for 21 days after each service.

We will alternate between Morning Prayer and Holy Communion each week, with the latter only being offered at St Mary's Yelverton initially as the South Aisle enables a one way system for receiving communion, which will be in one kind - the bread only.

I know that some will not be happy with the limited services, but I hope we can all be patient and understanding as we tread carefully in the coming weeks.

The Finances of the parishes are under great strain at this time; with no services except funerals for over three months, income has fallen significantly in most parishes and we are very unlikely to be able to meet our Benefice Share. We are not alone in this, of course, but the impact on the finances of the diocese and their ability to support the parishes by funding the cost of the clergy is severe. I would encourage everyone to be as generous as they can in giving to the Church and, if possible, offering what they would have given in collections if services had been taking place. At the Benefice Services, we will have five collection plates to enable the gathered congregation to make their gift to the church of their choice.

Finally, thank you for all you have done to support your communities during the last few months; for your understanding, your commitment, your generosity and your patient faith.

'I was rebellious as a young man, living in the mountains as a guerrilla. However, in the Civil War the Mengistu Government was overthrown and I became Prime Minister for five years 1991-95. Later I was arrested for embezzlement and sentenced to 18 years in prison.

I was in solitary confinement for five years but I had access to a Bible and was able to hear Christian Radio broadcasts, so I knew a little what Christianity was about. Then Jesus Christ appeared to me in my cell on three separate nights. He said to me, 'I AM Jesus Christ, follow me.' So I got on my knees and said, 'OK, Lord, do whatever you want with my life.' Immediately my life changed and I was able to forgive all those who had attacked me.

My wife had fled to a refugee camp in Ethiopia, where Jesus appeared to her also and told her to follow Him. So she became a Christian as well. Then, by the grace of God, I was released early for good behaviour. At once I publicly proclaimed Jesus as my Saviour. Every newspaper wrote about me. For the first time the name of Jesus was broadcast on national television!

The simplicity of Jesus's life amazes me. He had no possessions. We complicate Him. He simply asks us to open our lives to him. He alone can satisfy all our needs. Go on the journey with Him.'

Today Tamrat and his wife live in USA where he shares his faith in Christ in Churches and Universities across the country. As he says, 'I am doing my best to share the love and forgiveness that Jesus has shared with me.'


There will be another announcement in November or December. Meanwhile keep safe! The Committee of the WEA Loddon Branch wish you all well.

Obituary

Edgar Hoddy - 1955 - 2020

Edgar Hoddy, well known as the "gentle giant", sadly passed away on 6th April aged 64. He was well known, much loved and highly respected by all who knew him.

Born and bred in Norfolk, Edgar lived in Ashby St Mary all his life. He went to school in Loddon before joining the family business, Hoddy Brothers Farm, at the age of 14, and worked all over East Anglia. Outside of work, Edgar was captain of local darts teams and enjoyed long family drives in the countryside, which he knew like the back of his hand, accompanied with binoculars for wildlife watching.

Having an encyclopaedic knowledge of the Norfolk countryside, Edgar volunteered with the Broads Authority for three months and in 2002 was offered a job as a countryside ranger, a position he held for 17 years until his retirement. He dressed as Santa Claus every Christmas throughout his career.



As a much-loved employee at the Broads Authority, he mainly worked on patrol boats, and was a huge personality within the ranger team.

He was well known for the 'Edgar lean', propping

himself against a gate or fence at Whitlingham Country Park happily telling tales and anecdotes of his time on the Broads, especially his daring rescues.

He also ran a forestry school for disadvantaged children at Whitlingham where his lessons were focussed on basic skills for adult life and included



woodwork, tree felling and bow-making.

In May 2003 Edgar was elected onto the Ashby St Mary Parish Council and, reflecting his love of the countryside, was designated responsible officer for footpaths and trees, a role he took very seriously, and he served his parishioners until his tragic and untimely death. The countryside experience Edgar afforded the parish council will be almost impossible to replace from within Ashby's close community. Ashby St Mary has truly lost a giant of a character who will be sadly missed by all his family and many friends.

Due to the current situation, there was a private burial for family members only. Details of a memorial service will be announced at a later date.

WALK 7 Rockland St. Mary - Hellington - Rockland -2 miles

Start: Rockland St Mary Church Car Park, NR14 7EY.

Park at Rockland St Mary Church car park. Turn left out of the car park and walk to the school along Rectory Lane, a gravel road. Turn left into School Lane and, at the main road, turn right into Rockland Street. After about half a mile, and having passed the Post Office, you pass three pairs of bungalows on your right. The last one is No 86.

Immediately after no 86, at a footpath finger-post, take this grassy path that becomes a downhill path across a field. At the far side of the field continue straight ahead into a meadow (often boggy when it has been raining) with the hedge on your right. At the far right corner go through a gate and cross over the beck at a plank bridge.


This area is said to have been the site of a pitched battle between the Vikings and the Saxons at a time that the back would have been navigable, being part of the flood plain. In the early part of this century the marsh gas tended to self-ignite and the resultant flashes were held by some to be the souls of the soldiers who fell in that battle a thousand years before.

Back to the present! The path now goes uphill to meet the track that marks the end of Low Common, Hellington. Turn right and follow this track that becomes a metalled road to the T Junction at the bottom of Hellington Hill.

Turn right and cross a stream (the same one you crossed earlier) and, where the road bends to the left, take the footpath (called "Star Piece")on your right. It takes you past what was, until the 1960s, "The Star" public house.

At the end of the frontage of Glebelands Apiary the footpath turns left and goes uphill. At the top, at a right-hand bend in the path, the Old Rectory is on the left (note the old entrance for carriages) and the new red brick Rectory is adjacent.

Turn left into St Mary's Close and, at the school, turn left to arrive back at the church car park.

What's on in Rockland Benefice in August and September

- Open Churches. Three of our churches have re-opened for visits and private prayer Rockland St. Mary (Tuesdays), Surlingham (Wednesdays) and Claxton (Saturdays), between 10am and 5pm. You're welcome to come in please follow the safety notices that help keep everyone safe and help build confidence. Look out for further news on our other churches' re-opening plans.

Surlingham

Surlingham Staithe

Since lock down began, quite a few parishioners have started using Surlingham Staithe for launching canoes and it's lovely to see so many residents enjoying this village asset. As I'm sure most residents know, the Parish Council is the registered owner of the Staithe and manages it on behalf of residents.

Canoe racks are in the process of being installed, constructed of recycled plastic pipes, an ingenious idea of Councillor Reeve. The racks will be maintenance free and the pipes make it easy to slide canoes in and out



More racks will follow as supplies of pipes are made available. Identified canoes have been numbered and logged together with the owners details. **Please note**: unidentified canoes will either be sold or disposed of depending on condition.

But boat owners aren't the only people who use the Staithe; this beautiful tranquil little gem is also enjoyed by many other residents who simply walk down there to enjoy

the peace and quiet and to watch the wildlife who share the spot with us, such as kingfishers, dragon flies and the occasional deer. The access path continues to be mown and the areas either side left to rewild.



As pointed out above, lots of residents are now using the Staithe to launch their boats and the tranquility of the area would be lost if canoeists were to park their cars there. It is also a fragile environment being part of the flood plain. The area can be covered by several inches of water on very high tides or after heavy rain in summer as well as in winter months and even in high summer the ground is often spongy.

This photograph illustrates how high tides can affect the Staithe at any time of year, with subsequent tides keeping the ground saturated for several days afterwards.


The parish council trusts

that residents will comply with the notice restricting vehicular access to the Staithe except in exceptional circumstances when permission should be sought from a parish councillor on 538516.

Walk 10 Thurton - Bergh Apton - Thurton 2½ miles

Start: George & Dragon at Thurton (NR14 6AL)

Cross the A146 at the refuge island close to the bus shelter and take the footpath going uphill towards Norwich. Just after the Thurton village sign, re-cross the A146 and take a slip road into Prospect Place. Pass two new houses on your left



then, immediately past a pair of pre-war semi-detached houses, take the footpath off to the left. If you pass "Pine View and "Cynosure", you have missed it!

You are now on Sandy Lane, the border between Thurton and Bergh Apton that eventually reaches Cooke's Road - Point A on the map. Access to the next leg of the footpath, having crossed this road, is a little to your right. It follows the edge of a paddock running gently downhill to a pond on your right.

The footpath now crosses a field to meet White Heath Road (Point B). Turn left. Now look for a footpath fingerpost at a break in the lilac hedge on your right (Point C). Go through the hedge, cross the field going very slightly west of south and mount the earth bank at the far side. Heading south, cross a large field (aiming just to the right of the group of buildings at Holly Farm). When you get to Loddon Road you are at point D.

Turn left and walk on untilyou get to Bungay Lane on your right. Opposite, at Point E on the map, mount the bank and follow a Bridleway across a field to Lion Lane (Point F) and turn right.

After about 150 metres (just before the road bends to the right) take a rather rickety set of steps that mounts the bank on your left (Point G). The footpath now heads due north, equidistant between a power pylon on your right and a hedgerow on your left. When you reach the next field boundary, head towards the group of farm buildings now visible head of you.

When you reach them, the footpath on the ground (that differs from the official Public Rights of Way map)skirts the first building in a right-left dogleg that brings you out on Hall Road at Point H.

Turn left, pass the horse pond and the entrance to Beech Farmhouse and turn right onto an unsurfaced road that passes the entrance to Thurton Church and goes downhill to the back of Thurton Foundry. Turn left at the foundry and right at The Street to get back to your starting point outside the George & Dragon.
