

Little things really do matter . . .

In late June, I found myself sitting in Norwich Cathedral on a rather grey and chilly day. You may remember that we had some beautiful weather early on, but by that point in the month, just when the Bishop had invited us to come and spend our pre-ordination retreat in his garden, it had turned rather cooler. In fact on that particular day we were sitting huddled in a marquee as the wind blew through it, sending papers and vases of flowers flying. We said Morning Prayers together and then we were invited to find some space for meditation.

In the past I have looked for a quiet spot in the garden but faced with light drizzle I decided to take up the kind offer of the cathedral and seek some peace there. Of course, it wasn't entirely peaceful. The cathedral is open to visitors and so there is a constant flow of people through the building, but that wasn't all. The day before a weekend filled with not just the usual services, but also three ordination services, there was a lot of activity from the staff and volunteers to get everything ready.

I found myself a seat in the main body of the building, planning to reflect on the beautiful stained glass windows and yet I found myself watching as they carefully prepared the cathedral for the big events. It wasn't just the normal cleaning and polishing, there were also vergers puzzling over seating plans. Usually, they would just have to



plan where the senior church leaders would sit. In these covid restricted days, the congregation had to be mapped out too. There was also a team arranging the most enormous floral displays. In a building that size, a normal display would be completely lost so they were creating arrangements on a grand scale that almost needed a ladder to arrange.

It made me think about all the other people working in the background, preparing things that, come the excitement of the day, could easily be overlooked. There was so much to be done; from writing the service, choosing the music, preparing the sermon, to printing the service sheets and putting them on seats. The girls' choir would be singing for us which meant that someone, somewhere, was rehearsing them. Perhaps they would have to learn new pieces which they would be singing through at home. And who was preparing their robes and shining their shoes? The organist would have been practising their part for the day too, endlessly repeating phrases until they were perfect. Stewards would have signed up for duty and would be familiarising themselves with the plans so that they could offer help to guests and participants.

There was so much care and attention going into these things, many of which, on their own, might seem insignificant, but a single thing missed would stick out like a sore thumb.

Little things matter. Like the tiny pieces of glass in the cathedral's windows, when they are taken together they can become beautiful creations, even though each piece, set on its own might mean nothing. In the same way the things we do and the care we have for each other, our friends, families and neighbours, builds up into something amazing. Even if it doesn't feel that way at the time, the contributions we all make are important. This has never been more true than it is now.

You might feel that what you do doesn't matter. I wonder how many supermarket workers have said they 'just work on the checkouts' or 'just stack shelves' for instance, or how many hospital porters said they are 'just cleaners'. And yet in the last year and a half, people like them have been hailed as heroes for keeping things going.

It is too easy to only notice the glamorous or exciting jobs but, without the people working in the background to support them, things would fall apart. We are all part of God's glorious creation, individual pieces in a brilliant picture filled with colour and light, but unless all the pieces are there, whether at the centre or filling in around at the edges, the picture is incomplete. You matter.



We hope you are keeping well and looking forward to the new season! May I offer a very warm welcome to our summer visitors. Our churches are open daily and offer a place for quiet reflection and a sense of the long history of our villages and their connection with God and the wider world. You are very welcome to join us at our services and events. Details of our services can be found on the Group service plan on the back of *Eleven Says*, and updates will appear on the Rockland FaceBook page and village websites wherever possible. We offer a mix of face to face and video services. If you would like to join our weekly circulation list, please contact Nick or Helen (details on back page).

The Barn has re-opened for groups and we are planning some drop-ins in the Autumn so that you can come along and enjoy a cuppa with us. Please see the *Barn Owl* monthly newsletter for more information about Barn activities and its online Art Cafe.

On August 22nd the COP (Climate Change of the Parties) Relay comes to Rockland! Since the G7 Summit in Cornwall, there has been a multi faith walking relay heading to the COP 26 Climate Meeting in Glasgow, as an act of witness to world leaders assembled there to make effective decisions in the face of the growing climate emergency. One walking route, organized by the Young Christians Climate Network and supported by the Bishop of Norwich, begins in Great Yarmouth and crosses Norfolk before handing on to the next county group at King's Lynn. The route follows Wherryman's Way as far as Norwich, and walkers will cross Reedham Ferry before walking up our side of the Yare. They will come to the Barn in the afternoon for food, washing, rest and some will stay overnight, before setting off towards Norwich the following morning.

The walkers are mainly young Christians and Muslims, but people of all ages, all faiths and none are welcome to get involved in the following ways:

- 1. Walking part or all the route with the group.
- Writing a prayer and leaving it at one of the 'waystation' churches (e.g. Rockland St. Mary) or meeting houses to be carried by the pilgrims to King's Lynn.
- 3. Writing a letter to the Prime Minister and leaving it at one of the 'waystations' to be posted together with others from King's Lynn. Letters, messages and prayers can be e-mailed or left at the Rectory or in a box in St. Mary's porch in the weeks beforehand.
- 4. Offering to welcome the pilgrims at Rockland and to help with refreshments etc.

Thurton Benefice Update

Cate's Ordination: It was a great joy to be present at Norwich Cathedral on Saturday 26th June as Cate was ordained as a priest. She celebrated her First Mass at St Peter & St Paul Church at Bergh Apton the next day which was followed by refreshments in the churchyard. Thank you to everyone who worked so hard to make it a very special day for Cate, her family and all of us.

Church Services: At the time of writing there is still some uncertainty about the restrictions which may still be in place for public worship as we move into August and September. We are attempting to increase the number of services and adopt a pattern closer to that which each parish prefers. Please be patient as we carefully expand our provision and I would encourage you to check the rota on the back page carefully to ensure you head to the right church at the right time in coming weeks. Do be assured that we will continue to follow all the guidelines to keep us safe when we gather for worship.

On-line Services: Due to a marked drop-off in attendance and the need for the clergy to be available for an increasing number of physically present services, we have taken the decision to stop our online services. We will, of course, keep this under review as we move forward and if circumstances change as we head towards the winter months.

Weekday Communions: Monthly Services of Holy Communion are offered on the first Thursday of each month at St Mary's church, Yelverton. In August it will be on Thursday 5th and in September, Thursday 2nd. Both services will be at 10.30am.

Home visits and Home Communions: The clergy are very keen to visit anyone who is unwell or feeling isolated or lonely, either simply for a conversation or to share Holy Communion in their homes. Please do contact us if you, or anyone you know, would like a visit.

Finances: The financial situation for most of our parishes in the benefice continues to be a concern. Thank you to everyone who has been making donations either at services, direct to the church accounts via BACS or by cash or cheque to the treasurers or myself. Please speak to me, the churchwardens or treasurers for more information on how to set up a regular gift through your bank and how to increase that gift at no cost to yourself through the Gift Aid scheme for taxpayers.

Thanksgiving Service for David Blake of **Bramerton**



David Blake, 1936 - 2021

Captain Henry David Blake died on 21st June 2021 aged 85 and his funeral took place at St Peter's Church, Bramerton on 6th July 2021, followed by cremation.

David had lived most of his life in Bramerton and had a wealth of knowledge about the locality. Bramerton Hall had been the family



home for over 200 years and the Blake family have had a strong local presence throughout that time.

David had been a Bramerton Parish Councillor and in recognition of his considerable length of service to the Village was awarded the "Freedom of Bramerton" by the Parish Council when he retired from the Council two years ago.

He was also a member of the Bramerton Parochial Church Council with particular responsibility for the church building as Fabric Officer. His ancestors built the transept to the Church in 1860.

A source of much local history and village life spanning his lifetime, his knowledge and perspective will be greatly missed, together with his kindness and generosity of spirit.



Veteran Oak Tree - Garrick Field, Alpington

The Parish Council (PC) has responsibility for the very old Veteran Oak tree growing on the edge of the Garrick Field (Memorial Field).

Along with many villagers, the PC recognise that this is a much loved tree and its presence is valued, it can be seen from the public footpaths and nearby housing on Church Meadow.

Imogen Mole, South Norfolk District Council's Conservation and Tree Officer, visited and offered advice and compiled a report. Below are some of her comments:



"Ancient and Veteran trees are exceptionally valuable and considered an irreplaceable habitat. This individual has a stem diameter that qualifies it as ancient and also a number of veteran characteristics including decay features, such as branch death and hollowing. It has a good functional crown and is adapted structurally to these characteristics but there is evidence of fire damage.

The features present on this tree contribute to its biodiversity, cultural and heritage value and because of the evidence of fire damage coupled with its location in relative close proximity to dwellings, it could be at risk of future inappropriate work or further damage.

I recommend a Tree Preservation Order (TPO) is placed on this tree to secure its long term future and ensure best conservation practice and management of this tree."

If you are a BBC Spring Watch fan, the episode that aired on Wednesday 26th May explained why Oaks are such a valuable habitat supporting over 2,000 species. The Yelverton Oak now has a Tree Preservation Order (TPO) in place which will help to ensure its future for many years to come. The PC are currently planning for the Oak to be surveyed by a qualified tree surgeon and following this for any appropriate remedial work to be completed.

Housing and the Countryside

Anyone living in the countryside will be aware of the conflicting pressures of the need for more housing and the need to protect and preserve the countryside. As you read this article the consultation on South Norfolk Village Cluster Housing Allocations will probably have ended (August 2nd) and many of you will have expressed an opinion. The pressure for more housing in the countryside is increasing, and the Covid 19 outbreak has made many more people aware of the advantages in living with easy access to outdoor open space.

New housing impacts the environment directly through habitat loss, disturbance, increased traffic, more roads and pollution. However, the government has expressed its intention through the Environment Bill that all new development should lead to a 10% Biodiversity next gain; i.e. the negative impacts of housing should be offset by mitigation measures that have a greater positive impact on the environment. For that to happen it is important to know what is valuable about our local environment and what needs conserving.

In 2017 the South Yare Wildlife Group published the State of the Natural Environment report, which outlines all the unique natural features and important species of our area. This is available on request, or can be found on the SWYG website.

The Council for the Protection of Rural England have 6 key tests for planning which include the need for new housing to help achieve net zero target for carbon emissions, to reduce global warming and the threat globally to the natural world through climate change. Also, new developments must protect sites that are important for biodiversity and nature's recovery.

Housing developers are always driven by the need to lower costs and make profits, and therefore it is important that local people are vigilant and ensure that if housing goes ahead then that environmental mitigation measures are meaningful, can be sustained and lead to a genuine biodiversity net gain, and are just not "greenwash", and this is where we can have a real impact, both as individuals and collectively. If you want to help protect and conserve the environment please join us at SWYG. As the Covid 19 restrictions are coming to an end we are starting to plan walks and events for the Autumn and next year so please keep an eye on our website for further details.



There are currently nearly a million people in the UK with dementia, and this number is expected to rise to 1.7 million by 2050. Worldwide, the figure is closer to 40 million, projected to rise to a staggering 100 million by 2050 Already, every church and community in Britain has people and families who are facing the horrendous challenges of this truly terrible disease.

Pam Rhodes, BBC TV presenter of Songs of Praise, once put it like this:

"Dementia is a cruel robber. It robs people of their memory, their personality, their ability to recognise, it robs them of themselves and the life they've known. Confusion and strangeness replace the familiar and safe."

It has been found that many Christians with dementia respond well to having the Bible read to them, or hearing familiar hymns. The peace and reassurance of the words often have a wonderfully steadying effect - on both the sufferer and the carer!

With the Olympics in mind . . .

ERIC LIDDLE 1902 -1945

Eric, made famous by the film 'Chariots of Fire', was already well known for his performances in the 1924 Olympics in Paris.

He was tipped to win the 100 metres but refused to take part on religious grounds because the heats were to be run on a Sunday. Instead, he won a bronze medal in the 200 metres and then, amazingly, won the gold medal in the 400 metres, a distance at which he was comparatively inexperienced. Not only that, but he won in a world record time of 47.6 seconds.

He went on to become a Christian missionary in China.

During the Second World War, Liddle was interned by the Japanese and died of a brain tumour while still in the Weihsien camp.
