'Give Thanks, Remember and Celebrate'

The months of October and November are ones of thanksgiving and remembrance with the focus on Harvest services and the beginning of the Kingdom Season with All Saints' Day, when we celebrate all Christian saints known or unknown, followed by All Souls' Day. The latter is a more sombre day of prayer and reflection for the souls of those who have died; its observance was dropped by the Church of England after the Reformation, but it became popular once more after the First World War, in conjunction with Remembrance Sunday and Armistice Day, as a means of helping people to grieve the millions of lives lost.

Although Harvest can be celebrated from the beginning of September onwards, in the Thurton Benefice we usually wait until October when most crops have indeed been finally gathered in, which is especially appropriate given that we are a wine growing area and the grape harvest is usually in late September or early October.

In 2018, we combined the celebration of the grape harvest with the observance of the Feast Day of St Martin of Tours (11th November), the patron saint of various groups including viticulturalists. Martin was a soldier in the Roman army who rebelled against his superiors because of what he saw as the conflict between his Christian faith and being a soldier: 'I am the soldier of Christ: it is not lawful for me to fight'. He left the army and entered the religious life before becoming Bishop of Tours in AD 371. St Martin is best known for the legend of his cloak:



While Martin was still a soldier and stationed in Gaul, one day as he was approaching the gates of the city of Amiens he met a scantily clad beggar. He impulsively cut his military cloak in half to share with the man. That night, Martin dreamed of Jesus wearing the half-cloak he had given away. He heard Jesus say to the angels: "Martin, who is still but a catechumen clothed me with this robe."

In another version of the story, when Martin woke, he found his cloak restored

to wholeness. The dream confirmed Martin in his piety, and he was baptised at the age of 18.

The part of the cloak kept by himself became a famous relic preserved in Marmoutier Abbey near Tours. During the Middle Ages, the supposed relic of St. Martin's miraculous cloak (*cappa Sancti Martini*) was carried by the king into battle and used as a holy relic upon which oaths were sworn.

The priest who cared for the cloak in its reliquary was called a *cappellanu*, and ultimately all priests who served the military were called *cappellani*. The French translation is *chapelains*, from which the English word *chaplain* is derived. The small, temporary churches built to house the relic as it was being moved around became known as "capella", the word for a little cloak. Eventually, these churches lost their association with the cloak, and all small churches began to be referred to as "chapels".

Until the 16th Century we had a church (rather than a chapel) dedicated to St Martin in 'Apton' and as part of this time of thanksgiving for the Harvest, for the saints of the Church and the souls of our loved ones who have gone before us, as well as an opportunity for our communities to come together following the times of separation and isolation in the past two years, we are planning to have a walk of witness and celebration of the Feast of St Martin once again this year on Sunday 7th November.

I am delighted that the Bishop of Norwich will be joining us and we will start at the site of the Church of St Martin adjacent to Church Farm on Dodgers Lane in Bergh Apton at 3pm and walk across the fields to the Chet Valley vineyard where we will have a short service followed by festivities, including a re-enactment of the tearing of the cloak! Message from Bishop Graham of Norwich:

The appalling plight of families fleeing Afghanistan has been deeply moving to watch. As we seek to welcome some families to Norfolk and Waveney, I am re-launching the Bishop of Norwich's Refugee Fund.

This fund has given small grants to help with welcoming refugees from Syria and I am now extending it to support Afghans. It does not duplicate support that is provided by the State or other charities but looks for ways to help refugees settle. One example has been buying TV licences that help refugee families learn English and understand British culture and entertainment.

Parish Council Reminder - Overgrown Hedges and Roadside Obstructions

Overgrown hedges

Please would property and landowners check that overgrown hedges, trees, shrubs, etc are not endangering road users or pedestrians by blocking public pavements and pathways.

In order to avoid the overgrowth people might have to walk out into the road and also, the view of drivers, cyclists, etc could be impeded. It can also cause great difficulty for pedestrians with prams and pushchairs and



also to those using wheelchairs or mobility scooters.

Norfolk County Council will investigate if complaints are received.

Obstructions on Verges

There have been instances when road users have been endangered by obstructions on the verge of the highway. The placement of posts, stones, wooden blocks, etc impede road users when they need to take urgent action to avoid traffic.

Guidance from Norfolk County Council confirms that the verge forms part of the Highway and under the Highways Act, the Highway must not be obstructed, and must always remain available for Highway users.

In the event of accident and injury, and if the obstructions are deemed to be the cause, there is the possibility that legal action could be taken against the property owner to recover damages. Norfolk County Council will investigate if complaints are received.



How to Report a Pothole in Norfolk

A surprising number of people ask us how to report a dangerous pothole that they've seen. It's really easy once you know how.

It is the responsibility of Norfolk County Council to fix potholes, but only once they are told about them. If everyone thinks someone else will report it then perhaps no one will for a while, increasing the time that the pothole could get bigger and deeper, cause more damage or even cause an accident.



Potholes can easily be reported online. Make a mental note that you can get step-by-step instructions so next time you see a pothole be sure to report it, sooner rather than later. It's much quicker than you think.

When you click through to the Norfolk County Council reporting page, there are 5 screens to click through:

- One is clicking on a map,
- One is multiple choice,
- Two are just a single drop-down,
- And the other one is to write a quick sentence on how to find it at the map location.

You can also report a pothole by telephone by contacting Norfolk County Council on 0344 800 8020.

Sir Timothy Colman, 1929 - 2021

Sir Timothy Colman died on Thursday 9th September 2021 aged 91 at his home at Bixley Manor.

He was part of the Colman's Mustard dynasty and had a large farm in the Eleven Says area called Crown Point Estate. He leaves five children, 9 grandchildren and 3 great grandchildren.



Amongst his many roles were those of magistrate, Lord Lieutenant of Norfolk, President of the Royal Norfolk Show, and Chairman of the Eastern Counties Newspaper Group to name just a few.

He played a key role in the foundation of the University of East Anglia and Whitlingham Broad. He was a sailor of international repute holding the world sailing speed record for 14 years.

St Luke

To St Luke, whose Feast Day is 18th October, we owe a beautifully written gospel as well as the Book of Acts. He was a Greek physician and faithful travelling companion of St Paul. While under house arrest near the end of his life Paul noted 'only Luke is with me'.

Luke's gospel focuses on the compassion of Christ, and offers us moving parables, such as the Good Samaritan and Prodigal Son. Women figure more prominently in Luke's gospel than in any other: look out for the extended story of the Virgin Birth, and stories of Mary, Elizabeth and the woman who was a sinner.

His gospel also features more poor people, more lepers, more 'sinners', who are all shown to be 'inside' the love of Christ.

In Acts, Luke skilfully links sacred and profane history, as subsequent archaeology has shown. He tells of how the early Christians moved away from Jerusalem into the pagan world, and especially on to Rome.

South Yare Wildlife Group

Wildlife and Well-Being

The Corona virus pandemic has taught us, that we humans cannot separate ourselves from the natural world. A tiny virus, which can only be seen through an electron microscope, has brought our technologically sophisticated civilization to a complete standstill, exposing our vulnerability to aspects of the natural world we normally pay little regard to.

The Covid 19 pandemic led to a complete disruption of normal life, to lockdowns that were highly stressful for most people. One of the ways we managed to keep our minds and bodies healthy was through a daily walk, and engaging in the outside world. The corona virus has taught us how valuable access to the Natural world is for our own well-being.



Access to the countryside is not a luxury but essential for good mental health. Rights of way and Community Nature Reserves are assets we must do all in our power to preserve and expand. One writer who has made no secret of his own mental health issues is well renowned Natural History author, **Richard Mabey**. He wrote the book "Nature Cure" narrating his own descent into the darkness of a complete breakdown and how he slowly cured himself by reengaging with Nature and restoring his own well being.

The South Yare Wildlife Group has been fortunate enough to book Richard Mabey to come to **Poringland Community Centre** on **Thursday 4th November at 7.30 pm.** He will be in conversation with Henry Layte from the Book Hive.

Bats in Churches Project

Bramerton Church has recently been participating in the "Bats in Churches" project, of which the Church of England is one of the partners. The aim of the project is to better understand how bats use churches and the impact that they may have.

RSM Garden Club visit to Kirstead Nurseries

26 members of the Rockland St Mary Garden Club enjoyed a 'back stage' tour of Homestead Nurseries, Kirstead. Our guide for the evening was David Waller, who began with a brief history of when the nursery first began. It was back in 1986 when his parents, Jean and Bryan, bought the land and had the first glasshouse constructed. Since then, this family-run business has expanded into one of the most popular nurseries in the local area and beyond, taking pride in supplying a large and varied range of high quality plants and shrubs, all at reasonable prices too.

A borehole supplies the water used throughout the nursery and we were shown where and how the hard water is softened. David went on to explain that following the water treatment, the outcome is the closest to rainwater as is possible.

Before all the home-grown plants are sprayed with the water, nematodes* are added, resulting in the healthy plants and shrubs that are seen and purchased by regular customers and visitors to the nursery.


The photos on the right show how numerous machines are used to sow seeds or to fill different sized pots quickly and efficiently with the appropriate compost for various plants.

The nursery is always busy throughout the seasons but extra so leading up to Christmas when hundreds of holly wreaths are hand made (with some help from a machine) and sold every year. The wreaths prove so popular that customers are always advised to pre-order! Also on sale are hundreds of home grown, traditional plants that are purchased throughout the festive season. There are always various Christmas trees to choose from too.

Now we all know how much work is involved behind the scenes at the Kirstead Nursery and can appreciate the results seeing the many beautiful, healthy plants and shrubs on view to buy at our leisure.

Many thanks to Bryan, David and Ryan Waller for extending their working hours and for giving us a very interesting and informative evening. Thanks also to Ann for serving us with the welcoming refreshments.

*Nematodes are microscopic creatures that act as parasites on slugs, snails, vine weevil, ants, and other pests that spoil garden plants, fruit and vegetables, and lawns too. Nematodes disintegrate the pests from the inside out, so you will not see any evidence as you would do with chemical use. For the organic grower, this is a biological - not chemical - pest control. Unlike a chemical spray, which may drift off target, nematodes are specific to the host pest so that other wildlife is not affected. Please **note**: There are specific Nematodes for different pests so ensure to buy the appropriate ones for best results.

For most village communities the village hall is a prime focal point of community life. It provides a a venue for clubs, groups and social events such as quizzes. Rockland St Mary is no exception.

Rockland is fortunate in that it has an attractive and historic building, known as The Parish Reading Room. The Parish Room dates back to 1909. The site and the building was gifted to the village by a local businessman, J.T. Hotblack and the Roydon Trust.

Unfortunately, after many years of neglect and under investment the building was beginning to show its age. Indeed, by the turn of the century the building was bordering on the derelict. However, deliverance was at hand in the form of Keith Saxton.

Keith, a Yorkshireman by birth, had moved to Rockland in 1999 to take up an engineering job in Norwich. Right from the outset Keith had the vision to see beneath the cobwebs and mildew. Supported by a small committee, he set about restoring the Parish Room.


Over a long period of time they undertook a wide range of fundraising activities, including jumble sales and quizzes. Keith also proved highly adept at tracking down what public grants and subsidies were available and, more importantly, to put together

convincing business cases for the release of funds. A number of these grants emanated from South Norfolk Council.

Now in his 80s, Keith has stepped away from the day to day running of the Parish Room. Nevertheless, in recognition of his exceptional contribution to the Parish Room a plaque has been mounted on the wall of the Parish Room.

The plaque was formally unveiled and a presentation made to Keith by District Councilor Vic Thomson on 2nd September 2021.

Hellington and Rockland Community Reserve

In 2014 local people successfully joined together to form an association to rent 2.6 hectares of unspoilt land owned by the Church and in 2015, the Hellington and Rockland Community Reserve (HRCR) was recognised as a County Wildlife Site. The reserve lies between agricultural fields, nestled in a beautiful valley, bisected by the Hellington Beck. The rent helps the church and brings a sense of community to the 100 plus Stakeholders who pay £20 annually to support our special place for nature. We organise walks, run events, workshops and surveys, and encourage participation in volunteer working parties.

There is a dry, sandy meadow to the south and to the north the fen is low and marshy, edged with mature trees, dykes and ditches. A majestic oak stands on the highest part of the reserve. Our newly-

seeded flower meadow has already provided great colour this year, sown with a mix of annual and perennials, it will add to the existing wealth of native flowers. Many different species of birds, butterflies, moths and bats are heard and seen, and it is a



We have improved the ditches on the low fen and hope to create a pond for invertebrates, adding to the already considerable diversity. We have added two handmade oak benches to enjoy the views across the site. Paths wind around the perimeter encouraging walks through the various habitats, where there is always something new to discover. During the recent Covid 19 lockdown the value of the reserve became very apparent with an increase in the number of people using the open space for daily outdoor exercise.

HRCR enables us to promote an environment for the community and for the diverse species of flora and fauna to flourish. Our contributions from stakeholders help us to achieve our goals for the benefit of both the local and wider community, including the local school group who hold events on the reserve for the children.

We are delighted to announce that all our efforts have been recognised by the Council for the Protection of Rural England (CPRE) and we received a 'Countryside Champions' award at a ceremony held on 16th September, great news and a great community effort!
