What could you change to improve your life and the lives of others?

When Lent began on Ash Wednesday, (the day after Pancake Day) lots of people, of Christian faith and none, decided to 'fast' or to give something up until Easter day. It is a form of an old practice that dates back to the early Christian church. At one time if you wanted to be a Christian you were expected not just to study, but prepare for your baptism, usually held at Easter, by fasting for the immediate 40 days beforehand. This was to mirror Jesus's time in the wilderness where he stayed for 40 days before beginning his public ministry. Gradually the practice became popular with many Christians old and new, particularly in the Roman Catholic church. Above all it was a time for self-denial, reflection and prayer. Fasting from food was a way of showing commitment and helping you to think about what you were doing and why.

These days many people see Lent as a good way to apply some self-discipline and give up something that is not very good for their health or waistline such as chocolate or alcohol. A Christian might use each moment of denial as a time to reflect on their own shortcomings or brokenness but not everyone does.

I must admit I am not great at giving things up. I am full of good intentions in both Lent and at New Year, but I am pretty hopeless at keeping it going. I manage for a day or two but then I either forget completely or something happens to stop me. For instance, giving up cake - It's easy enough just not to buy cakes or to make them yourself, but what if you visit someone who has made a cake specially... surely it would be rude to refuse? I have a hundred ways to convince myself that I am just breaking the rules once, but by the end of week one, I have usually abandoned all pretence.

So when someone suggested that instead of giving up Bounty Bars for once I try giving up a sin, it struck a chord. That year I decided I would give up being angry! I am not generally someone who gets angry (my children might disagree of course) but even so, I have my moments, so stopping was quite a challenge. There are some circumstances where it is easy to count to ten and let it go, but there are others, for me mainly when driving, when it's much harder. But I did it. Every time I started to get wound up, I took a deep breath and calmed down again. I taught myself to control my temper and felt much happier as a result and so, I suspect, did everyone around me.

Pope Frances helpfully suggested some more things we could all 'fast' from that might improve our lives and the lives of others. He included fasting from hurtful words and using kind ones instead, fasting from sadness and being filled with gratitude, from anger to being patient, from pessimism to hope, from worrying to trusting in God and from bitterness to being filled with joy. They are all things which can cause harm but which could make a big difference if we stopped.

We often think about giving up things for our physical health, but how often do we pay attention to our mental health? How often do we stop doing something that we know makes us miserable and replace it with something that brings us joy? Unfortunately, just as we can get into bad habits with what we eat or drink, so we can find ourselves repeatedly saying and doing things that make us miserable.



Of course we can't stop doing everything at once because we are only human, but the problem is that just as we can reach for a treat, so sometimes do we reach for anger without pausing to think if there is another way. We may be bitter towards someone, and we don't stop to think about the damage it is doing to us although the other person may be unaware. There are so many ways in which we do ourselves and others harm and yet Jesus showed us that there is another way to live our lives without those dark and negative feelings and behaviours by looking for opportunities to be loving and kind.

By the time you read this Lent may already be over, but today is always the best day to make a change, you don't need to wait for a particular season. Imagine if we all decided to change one thing, how much would that change everything in even a small way. Perhaps today is the day - so, what would you choose?

Thoughts on Anglo Catholic Liturgical Tradition: Incense

In my lead article in the last edition of Eleven Says, I spoke of the plans by the Ashby St Mary PCC to introduce an Anglo Catholic Service at St Mary's and I said I would write some short articles over the coming months to give my thoughts on the significance of some of the liturgical practices associated with that tradition. I will start with incense.

The first thing to say, is that all liturgical practice is theological in its basis - nothing is done simply for 'show'. Incense is primarily about purification and sanctification; being made clean in order to become holy. In the Wisdom books of the Old Testament there is also a strong connection with prayer:

Let my prayer be counted as incense before you, and the lifting up of my hands as an evening sacrifice. (Psalm 141:2)

Christians have used incense as part of worship since the earliest days, continuing the Jewish tradition of cleansing the tabernacle or temple by following the commandment to Moses recorded in the book of Exodus: Aaron was instructed to burn incense on the 'Altar of Incense' as the way of cleansing the sacred space to make it a worthy place to worship God.

In the New Testament, of course, Frankincense is one of the gifts to the infant Jesus from the Magi, an indication that he was divine and to be worshipped and in the Book of Revelation, John the Divine sees incense being used at God's heavenly throne.

In our services in church, you will see the incense being used a number of times and each time it is significant:

- First, at the beginning of the service, the celebrant will cense the altar as an
 initial sign of cleansing (with the churches being quite rightly open to the
 public and with no knowing what may have occurred in the building during
 the week, this ensures the altar is cleansed and prepared for the
 consecration of the bread and wine to follow);
- The second use is over the Book of the Gospels before it is proclaimed as a recognition of the divine truth it contains;
- The third is over the bread and wine once they have been placed on the altar so that the earthly bread and wine are made pure and thereby the best we can offer to God;
- The fourth is over the celebrant to make him/her worthy to preside over the consecration;
- Then the gathered congregation are censed which can be considered in conjunction with the confession and absolution we are required to make/ receive before partaking in the sacrament.
- The thurifer (the person who looks after the thurible/censor) then stands before the altar during the consecration and allows the incense to rise before us and surround the altar to remind us that through the mystery of the Eucharist, our worship on earth is united with the perpetual worship in heaven. At the moment of consecration as the paten and chalice are individually raised heavenwards, the thurible is swung three times towards them to signify the sacred mystery that has taken place.

Incense has, therefore, a significant role in worship as a means of purification and sanctification of the building, the items used in worship and us. As it rises in the air it combines our personal and corporate prayers with the prayers of the saints, purifying us and allowing the Holy Spirit to work in us and make us Holy.

The Easter Lily Symbolism

There are several theories about the symbolism that surrounds the Easter lily, and much of it is related to the Christian religion.



Mentioned many times in the Bible, the white lily symbolizes purity, rebirth, new beginnings and hope and is most often associated with the resurrection of Jesus Christ as observed on Easter.

The trumpet shape of the Easter lily represents a trumpet sounding the message that Jesus has risen, and the nature in which lilies grow is symbolic of the resurrection as well. ...

Thus, lilies represent rebirth and hope, just as the resurrection does in the Christian faith.


White lilies are often used at Christian weddings. The reason for this is that, just like in ancient times, white lilies symbolise virginity and purity. The white lily is sometimes known as the Madonna lily, and is often depicted in religious art as the symbol of the Virgin Mary.

The flowers are often referred to as "white-robed apostles of hope," and they symbolize the purity of Christ, who was free from sin. In many paintings, the angel Gabriel is depicted as handing Mary white lilies, which symbolizes her purity as well.

From bulbs that grow underground for three years or longer, they become beautiful flowers. This process is reminiscent of Jesus's brutal death and holy resurrection.

Some think that it was white lilies that sprouted in the Garden of Eden as Eve's remorseful tears fell to the ground.

There are also theories that Easter lilies grew where Jesus's tears and blood fell from the cross, and lilies were supposedly found in the Garden of Gethsemane after the crucifixion.



In Pagan traditions, the Easter lily is associated with motherhood and is often gifted to mothers as a symbol of gratitude.





The sight and sound of swifts swooping through clear skies is one of the highlights of the English summer. These amazing birds spend their life almost entirely on the wing and even feed, sleep and mate in flight and only come to land when nesting. However, swifts are in trouble. The UK has seen numbers plummeting, with a 53% decline between 1995 and 2016 and as of December 2021 they joined 69 other unfortunate species on the Red list of 'Birds of Conservation Concern' which means there is a very real threat of them becoming extinct in the UK. The primary reasons for this rapid decline are thought to be a lack of nest sites due to modernisation of older buildings, the lack of suitable nest sites in newer builds and the reduction in abundance of their insect food supply due to the widespread use of pesticides.

Swifts return from their wintering grounds in Africa each spring to the same spot each year to breed in gaps under roof tiles and eaves. But due to our tendency to seal up buildings during renovations, swifts are returning to discover their nest sites have gone or access is blocked.

Given swifts hunt for insects over meadows, open water and woods, the villages in the South Yare valley constitute prime swift habitat – if only there was a greater abundance of nesting habitat!

To help address the lack of nesting sites the South Yare Wildlife Group is trying to start a project to help residents of the South Yare area get involved in helping this save this iconic species. 

Over the winter the footpath along the dyke below Flint Cottage and Church Lane became almost impassable but last week a new raised, boarded path holding 4 tons of gravel was installed running most of the length of the dyke. The riverside path gets a lot of usage and can be slippery so you need to walk with care.

If you take the path by the allotments you will see a lot of hard work has been done, including hedging planted at the Orchard, it is very impressive.

Preparations for the Jubilee Celebrations are now being planned. There will be a flower festival and cakes, including knitted ones, music and more in the Church. It will be a time to remember the good times and all the changes in Surlingham through the last 70 years.

Of Easter Bunnies and Historical Hares

The Easter bunny is here again, although signs are that the cuddly bunny rabbit now associated with spring and resurrection was originally a wild hare.

Rabbits today are often perceived as a pest by farmers and gardeners, but it was not always so. One of the perks inherited in 1275 by Maud de Multon, lady of the manor of Surlingham, was a "coningyerd" - a rabbit warren. Coneys (rabbits) were a much-prized delicacy in the Middle Ages, both for food on the table and as fur for clothing.

It's tempting to think that rabbits gave their name to Bunney's Broad, just to the right of the carnser (causeway) approaching Surlingham Ferry House. Sorry, no. The Bunne family were in the village as early as 1340, and a Robert Bunne was still living here in 1822 with land at Ferry Corner.

You'll find all this (and much more) in *Surlingham in Time: Meet the Medieval Ancestors* recently written, illustrated and produced by John and Christine Glynn. 



The mystery church on Page 4 . . .


. . . is St Margaret's Church at Toft Monks. Toft Monks is a village and parish in Norfolk located on the border of Norfolk and Suffolk about four miles north of Beccles.

The first impression of St Margaret's is the stunning octagonal tower. However, on closer inspection, the tower is in fact round on the inside and is likely to have been Norman in date before gaining a 13th century octagonal skin.

In the 15th century the battlements and lushwork panelling were added, and the top stage has tall lancet bell-openings, flanked by blank lancets to great effect.



Inside the two nave doorways seem likely to have been originally Norman in date, and in the west wall there are two strange Norman windows through to the tower. The chancel dates to the 13th century, and has two lancets to the north and south and a four-light east window. The nave has various Perpendicular style windows and porch, and a 15th century font with a 17th century font cover.


