The First Christmas Broadcast on the BBC . . .

The BBC has been much in the news this year, for both joyful and sad reasons. 2023 saw a drastically cut back local service on Radio Norfolk, replaced with regional programmes from mid afternoon on weekdays and the whole weekend, except for sports.

On a happier note, the BBC celebrated the centenary of its Charter this year. It has provided a wealth of information and entertainment and reaches far across the globe. Almost no one alive in our country today will have any recollection of life before the Beeb, although it did take a few years to cover the whole nation.

The BBC began life in November 1922, and at Christmas that year it produced Britain's first religious broadcast, a message by Revd John Mayo, Rector of Whitechapel in East London, and the first radio play, 'The Truth of Father Christmas'.

In 1928 it added the Carols and Nine Lessons from King's College, Cambridge and four years later, the first Royal Christmas message, delivered by King George V. The foundations for Christmas broadcasting were laid. Decades later, Morecambe and Wise would slot in as Christmas fixtures.

The Christmas Eve Carols from King's was dropped by the BBC in 1930, but by overwhelming popular demand was brought back the following Christmas and has been broadcast over an ever-greater area in the years that followed (it finally reached USA in 1979).

As Christmas approaches this year, I am drawn to reflect on its enduring appeal. It wasn't the first Carol Service - this had been created by the Bishop of Truro in 1880, to provide an alternative to the pub on Christmas Eve - the Service from King's was a shorter and more structured version created by its Dean, the Very Revd Eric Milner-White in 1919.

Milner-White had served as an Army padre in the First World War and had returned to King's College afterwards. When he arrived, the College was haunted by the conflict. Its Provost, Monty James, had resigned a year earlier, heartbroken at the deaths of so many promising young students. How could the joy of Christmas be presented after so much suffering?

In creating the Nine Lessons and Carols, Milner-White made something new seem ancient, traditional, almost timeless in its language and soothing in the sound of its familiar carols.

Its opening prayer, the Bidding, called listeners back to the Gospel's beginning: Let it be our care and delight to hear again the message of the angels, and in heart and mind to go even unto Bethlehem and see this thing that is come to pass, and the Babe lying in a manger.

The prayer doesn't gloss over the tragic loss of life in previous years, but instead gathers up the Christmas celebration into something both earthly and heavenly:

Lastly, let us remember before God all those who rejoice with us, but upon another shore, and in a greater light, that multitude that no man can number, whose hope was in the Word made flesh, and with whom in the Lord we are one for evermore.

Just over a century later, the world still suffers the pain of war. As I write this, the conflict between Ukraine and Russia, which neither side can win or afford to lose, grinds on. Israeli forces and Hamas continue to wage a war in which civilians on both sides are the main casualties. And yet ... the coming of the Christ child speaks of hope for unseen things, the transformation of the human heart that is the only path to lasting and just peace.

You are warmly invited to join the Churches of the Bramerton Group to share in this light and hope at Christmas and the New Year beyond.





Sanyu Babies Home, Kampala, Uganda

Believe it or not, individuals and members of The Rockland Group have been providing financial support for Sanyu for over twenty-five years. Currently we fund the two nurses, resident at the home and the twice weekly visits by the house doctor, reducing the number of costly hospital visits; no NHS in Uganda!

Sanyu is the home of last resort for babies abandoned on the streets of the capital, Kampala. As soon as the baby is brought in by police or others, it is given a name, health checked, fed and watered and thus beginning life in the Sanyu community. There is basic education until the baby is ready to be adopted, fostered or even returned to its family if found, perhaps four or five years later.



One of the aspects that shines out of the home's quarterly newsletters (let us know if you'd like to receive them) is the important role played by visiting volunteers who arrive at the home from all over Europe and America. Without exception the volunteers return after months helping look after the children, feeling fulfilled and in love with the home and its brilliant community, and many return for a second time.

We would especially like to thank Ruth and John Everett of Applebee, Rockland. They have been selling plants in aid of Sanyu for many years and were so taken with their endeavours that they visited the home to see at first hand what they were so valiantly supporting. There are also many of you that regularly send in donations for Sanyu. So thank you Ruth and John, and thank you to all you marvellous SANYU supporters. Please keep it up and encourage others to help as well. Especially this Christmas.

The right end of the telescope

As the Christmas season approaches we are faced with any number of things that need to be done or we think need to be done. We don't want to be caught out by not being prepared. We don't want to let people down and spoil this special time of year for them.

I am reminded of the story of Mary and Martha. One sister rushes around to feed everyone and get everything done. The other sits at the feet of Jesus soaking up every word and basking in the light of the Son of God. Mary and Martha didn't need a telescope because Jesus was there with them, but only one of them was really focused on Jesus.

There are lots of reasons to be busy, especially at Christmas time, but it is good also to be able to make the time to reflect on the bigger picture. It is a truly wonderful sight at this time of year to look out of the window on a dark night and see a myriad of stars spread across the sky.

One of the well-known Christmas stories is about the three wise men who gazed upon a new star and realised that it meant something special and extraordinary. They might not



have had telescopes in those days, but they didn't need one because the star shone so brightly. They knew they had to follow that star and if they hadn't made the journey they wouldn't have found the baby Jesus.

A paraphrase of a verse in John's gospel says that God so loves the men, women and children he created that he gave his only Son that whoever believes in Him should not be lost, but find peace and life everlasting.

The writer CS Lewis says that Christianity is the only religion that teaches we do not need to do anything to be put right with God and find that peace. Indeed we can never do enough to earn it because our best efforts fall so far short of God's standards. The beauty of the Christmas gift is that we only need to believe in baby Jesus, the man Jesus, the Son of God Jesus.

If we look through the wrong end of the telescope then everything seems so far away. If we turn the 'scope round things become much nearer. It is then that we can see the reality of God's love. We can reach out and touch it, we can bask in its warmth.

May you find the time this Christmas to pick up the telescope, make sure it is the right way round, and experience the true love of the living God.

Cyclamen persicum (Mini cyclamen) Persian cyclamen

Cyclamen persicum, which flowers from winter into spring, is the most popular variety of cyclamen. Perhaps most commonly known for the larger-flowering indoor variety, often referred to as the 'florists flower', there is also a small version, commonly



sold as mini cyclamen, that can be grown outdoors.

When planting cyclamen outdoors, they need to be placed in a spot where they are protected from hot sun and severe weather. Ideal locations in the garden are under trees or high-branched shrubs. As they are short in height, they are better towards the edge of borders or are ideal in rock gardens. They are also often frequently grown in baskets.

Growing to around 20cm in height, the delightful white or pink flowers sit boldly upright above its heart-shaped leaves. This popular plant is not frost tolerant, so be careful to avoid planting in frost susceptible places.

The cyclamen was one of the favourite plants of Leonardo da Vinci, he decorated the margins of his manuscripts with them.

Bramerton Speed Watch

As the year draws to a close it will mark almost four years of operations for the Bramerton Speed Watch team. During that time around 1000 vehicles have been reported to the police for speeding in The Street and along Surlingham Road, sometimes at speeds of up to 50mph in a 30mph zone.

Bramerton is one of almost 100 volunteer Speed Watch groups in Norfolk. In the 11 Says area there are also teams at Bergh Apton and Claxton. Speeding drivers are sent a warning letter by Norfolk Police and a much sterner one if they're caught for a second time. Across the county up to 2000 letters go out every month to drivers. Persistent speeders get a visit from the police.

Surprisingly perhaps, many of our hour-long sessions include at least one repeat speeder. 'White van' drivers are also disproportionately represented. On occasions police officers join us armed with their own speed gun and that can mean prosecution for offenders.

Norfolk Police tell us that speeding in rural areas is a constant issue. Unlike, for example, drink-driving or the use of hand-held mobile phones, the dangers of speeding has not registered with many drivers. The police and Norfolk County Council Highways' view is that a combination of measures, in our case Speed Watch and our portable SAM2 (Speed Awareness Messaging) camera which alerts drivers to their speed, at least help to mitigate the problem. The stored data goes to the police.

For the nine-strong Bramerton team, it is clear that the majority of speeding drivers - with the exception perhaps of those van drivers - are travelling to and from their homes in the adjoining villages, principally and most obviously Surlingham as well as Rockland, Claxton and beyond. That is partly evidenced by the number of repeat offenders. It seems that too many of us observe the speed limits in our own community but not elsewhere.

The Speed Watch team, which has the full support of the Parish Council, is always looking for more volunteers which would allow us to mount more sessions. Newcomers are given training and can do as many or as few sessions as they wish. Most do one a month. We're sometimes also asked why we operate from the same locations. That is because they are all chosen by the police who require us to put out warning signs to highlight our presence.

The aim is simple enough, to make our village roads safer for everyone using them, including cyclists, walkers and runners as well as our growing younger population.

Formed in 1989 and funded by the rental of two fields in the village, the charity is an amalgamation of three smaller charities, the oldest of which was established in 1672 to provide 'coals for poor people.'


Letter to the Editor



It has stood witness to a Christian way of life in the village all that time, and the restoration and repairs of recent years have been done to enable it to continue that witness for many more years to come.

The singing was an expression of celebration and I glanced around the building and thought of all that has been achieved over the years.

It is an amazing amount at some considerable cost but it's thanks to the goodwill of parishioners from our village, the never tiring efforts of the Friends of Thurton Church, support from neighbours in surrounding villages and the existence of grant aid from such bodies as English Heritage, the Pilgrim Trust and the Norfolk Churches Trust that we have a church building in such a good state of repair today.

The building work to the church is also ongoing. We have found woodworm and rot in the floorboards and Rentokil is due to start work mid November. New flooring will replace existing old boards and the work should be completed by mid December at a cost of £10,000.
